Currently, Indonesia is seeking to expand the use of coal to fuel industries especially to feed coal fired power plants replacing expensive oil fuels.

Currently the government is carrying out its crash program to build coal-fired power plants with a total capacity of 10,000 megawatts to be completed in 2010-2011. The program has pushed up demand for coal in the country. In 2006, Indonesia was already the world's second largest exporter of coal after Australia with exports totaling 184 million tons jumping from the fourth in the ranks of exporters after Australia, China and South Africa. The country's exports of coal were valued at US\$ 6.08 billion, but in 2007 export fell to 130 million tons valued at US\$5.05 billion.

The encouraging prospects of metal and coal mining industry in Indonesia has prompted PT Media Data Riset (Mediadata) to carry out studies with results compiled in a 565-page report.
